Oxley Road Update

Construction of Oxley Road has reached the final milestone of sealing 3km of road from chainage 36 to 39 km. Construction was completed in conjunction with a local subcontractor and Council crew. It includes importing over 12,000 cubic meters of gravel from Glen Dee Pit. Work on this road involves shaping and raising the existing road pavement to RMS Standards and also includes shaping the drainage.

In addition, 1km of road surface has been formed and raised to be an all weather gravel road.



I am pleased to advise Council will be receiving funding through the Drought Assistance Grant, in which eligible Councils are provided with up to \$1million for local community infrastructure and other drought relief projects.

I would like to congratulate the entire team for their efforts in finalising some major milestones in construction work. These projects include: - The Balranald Truck Wash including a Bio-Security set down bay for drivers to check the vehicle in a clean dry area. - The Wool Track road formation and sealing, this represents the achievement of a milestone for our community with the road between Balranald and Ivanhoe being fully sealed (a long awaited outcome) - The formation and sealing of an all weather road length between Homebush and Oxley, this latest section has achieved significant savings with 3kms being achieved where the budget only predicted 1.7kms. A Huge Well Done to the team!

The main street upgrade under the Stronger Country Communities Grant is about to commence construction with the final design and project scope being approved by the State Government. This project has been developed by the community with the feedback from numerous workshops and discussions resulting in what will be a great outcome for the community and businesses. Thank you for the feedback and for those businesses and community members who actively participated in the scoping phase of this project.

Little Bunyips Open Day

The Balranald Little Bunyips Playgroup held an open day Thursday 27 June 2019, inviting the community to come and see what Playgroup is all about. It was an opportunity to thank the Balranald Inc Community Partnership Committee for the grant they approved for \$4,000 towards the new play equipment for the children.



14 children were in attendance as well as their mums and dads, representatives from the Balranald Inc and members of the community. It was a sunny winter day, perfect weather for the event with youngsters running about outside, completely thrilled at the variety of new things to play with.



New equipment purchased with the grant included an activity board, which was a hit with all the children. Numerous kids took turns having conversations on the play phone as well as ringing the bell and playing with the latches among other objects attached to the board. The activity board supports the social development of the children, motor skills. The reverse of the structure is a chalk board. The new sand pit, relocated and upgraded from its former

position, was likewise popular as several children were digging and chatting. The children advised they were building a new road for the city, the four working collaboratively to dig with shovels and a mini excavator. It was wonderful to see the imagination and creativity of the children thriving in the new environment. Above the sandpit is a new shade sail also purchased with grant funds. This will provide essential shelter from the sun in the summer seasons to come.

The grant also allowed for the front fence to receive a crafty upgrade. Perspex boards have been mounted for fun outside creative play. The Perspex can be painted and later washed, or have art stuck to it. Nearby in the front yard stands a new swing set, a giant sturdy structure sure to bring years of enjoyment.



The grant has brought many new assets to the Little Bunyips Playgroup, who extend their thanks also to the community members and organisations who helped with the upgrade. Jess said it has truly been a community effort with parents and local business support.

Playgroup is such a valuable asset to the community for parents and kids alike. Playgroup is a great network for parents to get together for



a chat, to connect and relate over the joys and struggles of young kids, a support system and information point. It is a great place for both parents and kids to socialise and make friends. Regional Youth Taskforce

Have you ever been interested in having a real say in the things that matter to young people in regional NSW? Are you aged 12–24 and living outside of Greater Sydney and the local government areas of Newcastle and Wollongong?

For the first time, the NSW Government is offering regional young people the opportunity to share their voice on issues such as getting a job, mental health and wellbeing, getting around and having things to do. The Regional Youth Taskforce will be solutions-focussed, having a say on ways the NSW Government can try to improve outcomes for regional youth.

The Regional Youth Taskforce advises Bronnie Taylor, Minister for Regional Youth on issues that affect young people living in regional NSW. The taskforce will also have input into the way the NSW Government will act on these issues.

Domestic Firewood Permits – Yanga National Park

Permits are available from 1st May until 30th September 2019 for domestic firewood collection on Yanga National Park. The available firewood is from a single collection point and consists of redgum milled timber offcuts (sleeper backs). Permits cost \$25/tonne or \$12.50/tonne for pensioner concession with a limit of 6 tonne per household per year. Permits are only available to residents of Balranald and Murray River Shires.

Changed Traffic Conditions

Roads and Maritime Services advise of changed traffic conditions on **Swan Hill Bridge** for essential maintenance work.

The bridge will be temporarily closed **Monday to Thursday nights, between 11pm and 6am from Monday 29 April to the end of August 2019**. The work involves strengthening the bridge structure to remove the current width restriction.

Motorists will be detoured via Nyah Bridge on the Speewa Road.

Heavy vehicle restrictions will apply throughout the work to protect Swan Hill Bridge from heavy loads. The bridge will be restricted to semi-trailers at 42.5 tonnes, with B-doubles prohibited. The 24-hour detour for B-doubles is via Tooleybuc Bridge. Please refer to NSW heavy vehicle maps.

Sensors & cameras will monitor the bridge's load capacity and heavy vehicle inspectors will have an increased presence in the area to monitor compliance. Pedestrian access will be maintained at all times.
